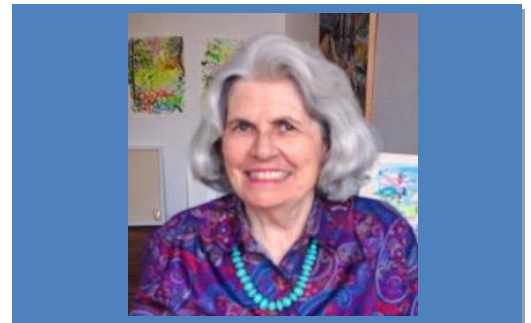
Lully Schwartz

My work is exhibited nationally with an emphasis in New York, Massachusetts and Maine.”



Suzanne Hodes

Suzanne Hodes has been exhibiting her paintings, drawings and prints for many decades in the Boston area, New York and Florida. In 1982 she co-founded "Artists for Survival" to support the nuclear freeze and social justice. Hodes grew up in New York City, studied with the legendary expressionist, Oskar Kokoschka in Salzburg, and earned a Fulbright grant to Paris as well as a Bunting fellowship grant to study in Israel. Her work may be found in over 600 collections including the Fogg Art Museum at Harvard University, the DeCordova Museum in Lincoln, MA, the Danforth Art Museum in Framingham, MA, the Portland Museum of Art in Maine, the Art Complex Museum in Duxbury, MA, and in many public and private collections.

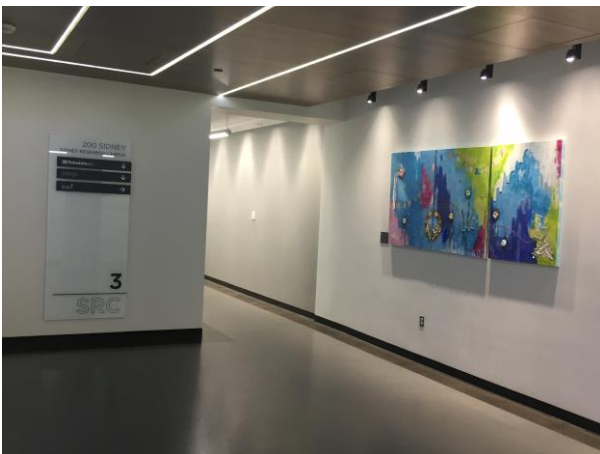

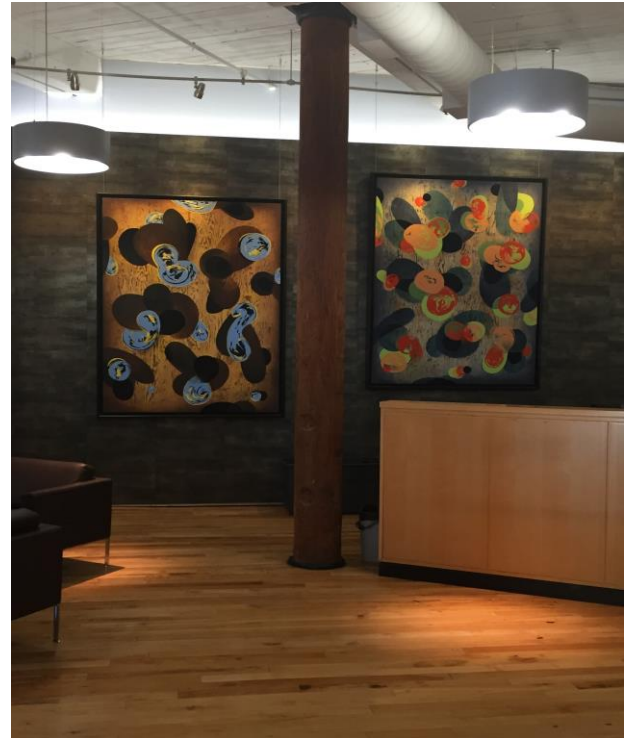

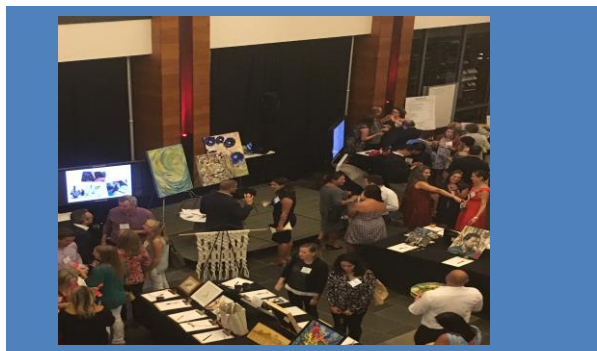
